

GERMAN WORKERS DEFY BIG BUSINESS

Challenge Plans of Industrialists
for Coalition on Industrial Loan.

READY FOR OFFENSIVE

Issue Platform Demanding
State Ownership of Quarter
of All Industries.

German trade union leaders have taken the initiative in challenging big industry by announcing what for the present stands for the minimum demand of Germany's 10,000,000 organized workers for the reform of state finances. It is a drastic platform, with plans calling for state participation in all industry, the nationalizing of mines and heavy penalties for tax dodging. It propounds a basis for negotiations with employers, but these already have shown that they have no intention of discussing several of its points.

There are two general lines of thought in Germany as to the best way of ending Germany's financial chaos and meeting the reparations payments. The industrial group suggested a few months ago that all productive property in Germany be pledged as security for an international loan. The Socialists want the state to become a fourth owner in all German corporation and proportionately tax private producers with whom the state cannot share ownership.

Trade Union Demands.

The platform of the trade unions includes these ten points:

1. Participation by the State to the extent of 25 per cent. of all stock in companies.
2. Socialization of the coal fields.
3. Operation of railroads along business lines.
4. Sharper control of exports to enable a greater accumulation of foreign exchange for Government purposes.
5. Limitation of imports to the lowest possible minimum.
6. An export tax to absorb all profits from the difference between the domestic and foreign price.
7. Quick collection of a capital emergency tax.
8. Taxpayers to be required to pay taxes according to their own estimates immediately, those making an estimate 25 per cent. below the eventual assessment to pay the difference plus a penalty of 50 per cent.
9. A heavy tax on stock exchange winnings.
10. Closer State supervision of private monopolies.

Workers Ripe for Offensive.

The trade unions which have been quiet as a political factor since the Kapp overthrow have now thrown their hat in the ring. The sudden collapse of the mark brought wages and prices out of all proportion again so the workers are ripe for a new offensive and unless the political leaders succeed in saving the big coalition despite its recent defeat labor may be united for a real test of strength with capital this winter.

The Wirth Ministry is unable to bridge the chasm between the industrialists and the trade unions and at present stands under the influence of the majority Socialists. The Cabinet rejected the terms of the industrialists which called for private management of railways as a condition for putting the loan through, and is believed to be working out a drastic programme of taxation.

ALLOWANCE TO CHARLES IN EXILE AT MADEIRA

PARIS, Nov. 16.—The Council of Ambassadors to-day fixed the amount of money allowance to be given former Emperor Charles or Austria-Hungary and his family and the conditions under which this expense shall be taken over by the States which are successors to the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Portugal is to be free from any charge.

The Associated Press learns that no amount has been set for the maintenance of Charles. A sum between 500,000 and 500,000 gold marks yearly has been mentioned as the probable amount which Charles will receive. Great Britain seems prepared to find the money for the support of Charles until the arrangements are made with the former Austro-Hungarian State, and possibly Italy, for his support. No country, however, shows any inclination to shoulder the indebtedness of Charles in Switzerland, which still amounts to between 2,000,000 and 3,000,000 Swiss francs.

GIBRALTAR, Nov. 15 (Associated Press).—Former Emperor Charles of Austria-Hungary and former Empress Zita are nearing their place of exile on the island of Madeira. The British cruiser Cardiff, with the former royal pair on board, arrived here to-day on route to Funchal.

Five Times Complete, Final
Choice Unmade.


