

**MRS. RYAN DYING,  
TWO LETTERS FOUND**

**Wrote That She Was Going to Die, but Says Missives Were Dictated.**

**THIRD AMERICAN IN CASE**

**Peter McCoy Admits Woman Attracted Him, but Denies Urging Divorce.**

Mrs. Audrey Creighton Ryan to-day submitted to another session of questioning by a Magistrate in which she reiterated that not only was she forced to take poison from a bottle held out by her husband, Thomas Stewart Ryan, an American newspaper correspondent, but also that he forced her to write letters to her mother and to the man she intended to marry, if granted a divorce, stating that life no longer interested her, "He terrorized me," Mrs. Ryan said, "I wanted to write that I wanted to live and be happy, but he threatened to kill me unless I wrote what he dictated."

Mrs. Ryan's mother, Mrs. Creighton, to-day engaged two French criminal lawyers, M. Le Grand and M. De Pachment, to aid the American lawyers, Benjamin Conner and Henry S. Bacon, in prosecuting the charge of poisoning, under which Ryan is being held without bail.

**Condition Nearing Crisis.**  
Late this evening Mrs. Ryan's condition was nearing a crisis, from which the doctors in the American Hospital at Neuilly do not expect her to survive. At the Paris Prefecture of Police it was learned that the poisoning charge would be changed to one of murder in case the woman dies.

This afternoon the Judges questioned Peter McCoy, a prominent American about town, as to his relations with Mrs. Ryan. He admitted that he was greatly attracted by her personality, but that he had never urged her unduly to obtain a divorce. The letters alleged to have been written under duress by the dying woman were made part of the dossier this afternoon. The first, addressed to McCoy, says:

"I am going to die because I love

you too much." And on the envelope Mrs. Ryan had written her testament, as follows: "I wish you to inherit my violin, the last thing I will ever give you." The second letter, addressed to her mother, read:

"When you receive this letter I will be dead. I ask your pardon for acting thus, but I find myself in the midst of circumstances which, if you knew, you would never blame me for wanting to die."

**Ryan Questioned Again.**  
When shown the letters in the hospital ward Mrs. Ryan, although suffering terribly, held to her original story, declaring, "I admit writing them, but it was under the influence of terror."

Ryan to-day when questioned in the presence of his lawyer took his plight humorously, and declared: "The only terror my wife is likely to have suffered was at the idea of taking up married life with me."

But he failed to explain why his wife rushed into the hotel corridor, crying: "He has murdered me!" or why he carried the poison in his suitcase or why he had decided to quit his hotel when he learned that his wife's condition was critical enough to warrant the suspicion that murder had been attempted.

**GARLAND AND WIFE BECOME RECONCILED**

**Idealist Who Accepts Million Legacy to Leave Farm.**

Boston, Jan. 14.*—Charles Garland, who a year ago refused to accept a million dollar legacy from his father's estate and whose wife left him as a consequence, taking with her their little daughter, besides accepting the legacy, is reconciled with his wife and will leave his North Carver farm for a life of ease and luxury in Dedham.

Mr. and Mrs. Garland will move on Monday into a new house in Dedham. It is said the reconciliation was brought about in no small measure by the expected arrival of the stock.

When young Garland finally did accept his fortune he announced that he would keep but \$500 for himself, give \$200,000 to his wife and infant daughter and give away the rest of the million. It was after this that his wife left him and went to live in the mansion of her parents while her idealist husband followed his Tolstol-like inclinations and worked the soil for his subsistence.
