

GUNNING SEASON ON FOR SHORE BIRDS

Black Bellied and Golden Plover and Greater and Lesser Yellowlegs Are Here.

The sport of shore bird shooting, now in season, attracts many New York city sportsmen to the marshes and sea beach feeding grounds of the four minor species of game birds specified in the national migratory bird law as legal prey for the gunner from August 15 to November 30, inclusive, except where State laws specify later other dates for opening or closing the season.

Under the restrictions of the Federal law, the shooting or killing of several of the smaller species of shore birds is permanently prohibited, the sportsman being permitted to kill only black bellied and golden plover and greater and lesser yellowlegs, and not more than fifteen birds of any or all these species may be legally taken in one day by any shooter.

Protection for Small Birds. Absolute protection of the smaller birds, which probably objectionable to greedy gunners, will meet the hearty approval of sportsmen working in harmony with the purposes of the various organizations devoted to the cause of conservation.

Of the four species of shore birds mentioned as legal prey for shooters, the black bellied plover is largest in size, about a foot in length, and vary to a certain extent, but readily enticed with grain.

A shore bird awakening conflicting emotions, when putting in appearance along the coast, is the greater yellowlegs, bearing the nickname of "greater Tell-Tale," "Tattler" and "Teper."
