

SHIPPING NEWS FROM ALL PARTS OF THE WORLD

BIG DROP IN DEMAND FOR COAL TONNAGE Increase Expected When Roads Show They Can't Haul Enough Fuel.

The charter market was extremely quiet during the latter part of the week, a fairly brisk business in grain falling to compensate for the abrupt falling off in demand for coal tonnage.

In view of the better prospects for domestic coal, commitments for the foreign product were fewer than the week before, but freight rates so far have held steady.

In grain the available orders were mostly for Gulf loading, with a fair demand also from Montreal and principally to Mediterranean ports.

Pacific coast lumber cargoes are offered freely to United States Atlantic ports and to the St. Lawrence, the rates, respectively, being \$12.50 a thousand feet and \$15, representing a slight advance on quotations for the Gulf.

DISCOVER SHIPWORMS ALONG JERSEY COAST Engineering Foundation Finds Species of Naval Borer.


