

FINDS HYLAN ABUSIVE IN LOSING ON TRANSIT

McAneny Says Mayor's Behavior in High Place Is Increasing Disgrace.

SHOWS OWN ECONOMY

Mandatory Laws Which Increased Budget Have Been in It 15 Years.

PAYROLL ACTUALLY LOW

Commissioner Asserts He Has Shown Mayor's Ideas on Uses in True Light.

Reviewing what he calls "the Mayor's campaign of falsehood, through which he has been attempting to deceive the people," George McAneny, chairman of the Transit Commission, said yesterday:

"The Mayor occupies the not unfamiliar position of a man with a lost case 'sassing' the court. His paper 'plans' for new subways have been torn to pieces. His willingness to turn a large part of the existing 5 cent fare system into a system of double fares in order to gain his ends has been pretty thoroughly exposed. Incidentally, and to the Mayor's great distress, a lot of unexpected light is being thrown on the meaning of his brand of municipal operation.

"I do not gather that the Mayor will abandon the campaign of falsehood through which he has been attempting to deceive the people. This morning's papers bear evidence of that.

"He knows, however, or, if not, those who prepare his statements know, that his arguments are gone. But abuse is always a handy weapon.

Expense in Budget 15 Years.

In his Board of Estimate talks the last few days the Mayor sought to give the impression that the budget of the Board of Estimate is about to pass because of the sum of \$2,500,000 because of the law requires that it carry the expenses of the Transit Commission. The truth is that the expenses of the transit authorities have been carried in the city budget for fifteen years past, and that during the present year the Transit Commission has spent less than its predecessor spent.

"For the work of transit construction the commission inherited the Board of Estimate for 1921 had appropriated \$2,190,000, which was about level with the appropriation made for Commissioner Delaney the year before.

"The Mayor says that the three members of the commission, drawing salaries of \$12,000 a year, succeeded on Commissioner so paid under the preceding State administration. The fact is that the present three Commissioners succeeded not one but two at \$12,000 each—the Transit Construction Commissioner and the Public Service Commissioner for the first district—and four salaries at \$2,500 each, an offsetting total of \$60,000.

Salary List Reduced.

"The Mayor says the commission has added material to its list of exempt positions at a net increase of \$103,000 a year. He cites various individual positions, clearly implying that the positions are new and the salaries unusual. The truth is that the commission, when taking office, inherited thirty-two then existing exempt positions, other than deputies, with a total salary roll of \$128,000. This list it has reduced to thirty, with salaries aggregating \$105,500, a net decrease.

\$400,000 FIRE IN NASHVILLE.

Four Buildings, Locomotives and Cars Burn.

NASHVILLE, Oct. 27.—Fire, sweeping through the main shop of the Tennessee Central Railway here tonight, destroyed three adjoining buildings covering an acre of ground, five locomotives and more than thirty box cars, together with much valuable machinery.

The loss was estimated at \$400,000 when the flames had been placed under control at midnight.

NEW I. R. T. ISSUE APPROVED, FIVE CENT FARE ASSURED
