

MICKY WALKER, CHAMPION OF BRITAIN, 12TH CHAMPION OF WELTERS

FORMIDABLE CLASS WITH RYAN AT TOP. Mysterious Billy Smith and Walcott Made It Lively for All Contenders.

DIXIE KID'S GOOD CLAIM. Britton Oldest and Most Industrious Champion of Class and Walker Youngest.

By CHARLES F. MATHISON. Micky Walker, the newly crowned monarch of the welterweight division, is the twelfth boxer to hold the championship of the 147 pound class.

Britton held the championship for four years and unquestionably did more fighting than any other welter champion in the history of the class.

So far as Walker is concerned he has several worthy rivals, of whom Dave Shade, George Ward and Sailor Friedman are the leaders. There are other 147 pounders who may develop into contenders for the honors, but the class as a whole is not to be compared to that which flourished in the decade beginning with 1894.

The first authentic champion of the class was Tommy Ryan, whose name was Joseph Young, a native of Redwood, N. Y.

In 1894 Tommy Ryan looked as the best man in the class and he beat Mysterious Billy Smith, his nearest rival, in a twenty round bout for the title at Minneapolis July 26, 1894.


