BEATS FEET OF 13 AT MILE IN 1:40 1-5

General Thatcher Second and Solisa Third With Favorites in the Ruck.

KELLERMAN'S A SURPRISE Outsider in Four Horse Field Wins the Patapasco in Run-away Fashion.

Special Dispatch to THE NEW YORK HERALD. PIMLICO, Nov. 10.—Another of the season's classics fell to the favor of a filly when Out Out, ridden by W. Pool in the Montfort Jones stables, carried off the rich Wilden Stakes at Pimlico to-day, running the mile in 1:40 1-5, to get up into the last yard to a fair start.

For different reasons the original field of twenty-four was reduced to fourteen at post time, so that all the starters were able to break from one line, and the race was as truly run as could be expected over a narrow track with sharp turns.

The youngster who rode the winner was entitled to all the honors for the way he sent the daughter of Sir John Johnson through rounding the final turn and for the vigorous finish he rode.

After nine minutes' delay at the post caused by General Thatcher, the field went away to a fair start. Cyclops, attended by General Thatcher, provided the pace to the home turn, where the Gerry colt quit and Thatcher assumed the primary lead which Out Out robbed him of in the last few jumps.

Kellerman, ridden by L. Fator, provided one of the bright days of the season when he showed the way through the fourth and fifth turns, and at one and a sixteenth mile, and lasted long enough to withstand a perturbation rush by Emotion, the odds-on favorite.

MULDOON SAYS SIKI CANNOT FIGHT HERE

New York Commission Will Enforce Ruling of French Federation.
