Foundation Diggers Find Old Mott Street Tombs

TWO headstones from an almost forgotten burying ground were unearthed yesterday by workmen digging the foundation for the parochial school of the Church of the Transfiguration parish at 33 and 35 Mott street.

One of them was inscribed: "In memory of Catherine, wife of Adam Hyler, who departed from life May 27, 1819, age 71." The other inscription was: "Wife of George Sparitius, who died October 7, 1809." The stones are well preserved and have been placed temporarily in front of the Church of the Transfiguration, Mott and Park streets.
