PECULIARITIES OF THE EDITORS AND REPORTERS OF ITALY.

The Italian newspaper is generally an exceedingly small sheet, printed on a poor quality of paper and in coarse type. It is well enough to print a paper in large type when the motive is its convenient perusal, but that is not the object of the publishers of Italian journals.

The place where the paper is printed may be part of an ancient palace, for this species of office varies in its uses in Italian cities from a stable to the abode of princes.

The chief editor of an Italian daily is usually a thin, careworn, thoughtful being, like those who stand at the editorial writing, speaking French with more or less readiness, and content to visitors according to the measure of his duties.

Italian papers are usually either morning or evening, but they appear at all hours of the day and night with a consistency of repetition that is bewildering to a stranger and seeks to confound their identity.

So the Italian gentleman, sitting at a cafe with his family or friends, luxuriously enjoying a second cup of coffee, a second glass of Marsala, a cordial equally insipid, or a second cup of such as the Italian confidant, who so well how to reverse, is willingly interrupted by the gain with the extra edition of the evening newspaper, or of the morning edition which has been prematurely published.

The reading habit is growing in Italy, as shown not only by the sale and perusal of papers, but by that of cheap books and manuals on all sorts of subjects, popular and scientific, which authors and publishers are sufficiently patriotic and thoughtful to supply in copious quantities and at cheap prices.

There are about 200 daily newspapers in Italy, and as the three which have been described in this general way are in the largest cities, the imagination will have to deprecate those which are published in the smaller.

Nothing analogous to the county or village newspaper in America exists in the Italian peninsula. Of the 200 daily papers it is said that at least two-thirds are liberal, that is, they favor the extreme extension of constitutional liberty, or a republic for which, with great good sense they are willing to wait.
