OF THE PORTSMOUTH STREET
TWAY COMPANY and the thriving little municipality across Hampton Roads in which it does business is a striking illustration of how foolish men can be when they make a desperate effort in the direction of silliness.

It seems that there has been a change in the grade of some of the streets and for some reason, whether good or bad, is immaterial, the street railway refused to raise the tracks so as to correspond with the new condition of affairs. Undoubtedly a city has the right to regulate its streets so long as it does not step beyond the bounds of its charter. There can be no doubt, however, that the street commissioners of Portsmouth adopted the wrong course to force the railway company to a proper observance of the law of the city. According to the published reports he bolted large pieces of timber across the tracks at the objectionable crossings. It would be difficult to conceive of a more silly and childlike piece of official authority than this. Portsmouth has the power to force the railway company to observe the street grade or else it has no right to interfere with its tracks. Now, if the city has the right to enforce its laws in this respect, the street commissioner could have pursued the company to terms by bringing a more dignified course. To be sure, if the street railway company is stronger than the municipality of Portsmouth the little city is in a bad way, but its officers can never hope to obtain prestige and respect by such childishness as that manifested in the matter under consideration.
