NEW YORK STOCK MARKET. NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—The stock market today continued to show marked difference to the disturbances in foreign markets on account of the war scare and of money difficulties, as well as to the continued stiffness of the local money rate.

CALL MONEY EASIER. The market for call money in New York showed further relief from the extreme stringency, although by no means on an easy basis.

The undertone of the market for stocks was very firm. This was not due to any large demand, even in the case of stocks which moved quite widely, but rather to the bidding up of prices by those interested in seeing a higher figure for the holdings.
