

PRESIDENT IS WAVERING

Rumor Growing Stronger That He Will Accept Another Nomination.

HUGHES FEARED ABOVE ALL OTHERS

Roosevelt's Friends in New York State Are Engaged in an Active Campaign to Discredit the Governor—Circulating Harmful Stories.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 15.—Every Republican who cares to see the President three days declares he is ardently in favor of a third term.

Representative Hale, the Republican boss of Tennessee, had a long talk with the President this week, and outlined to him the plans of the Republicans of that State to compel him to take the nomination, which included the holding of an early convention, and the selection of a delegation instructed to vote for Roosevelt.

Strong Evidence of Change. The administration attacks upon Governor Hughes of New York, are probably strongest evidence of the intention of the President to accept the nomination if offered it.

It is believed that a very early convention of New York Republicans will be held. The third term people appear to be agreeing upon this policy in the hope of catching the delegations before the candidacies of other men—"favorite sons"—have developed. It should be remembered in this connection that, despite the great popularity of Grover Cleveland with the masses of the party in New York State in 1892, David B. Hill, who was in control of the Democratic organization got the delegation through a "smash" convention. Mr. Cleveland was nominated, though his own State delegation was against him.

STOCK MARKET QUIET

Liquidation Not Large in Volume But Urgent in Character.

WAS NO DEMAND FOR SECURITIES

The United States Steel stocks continued to feel the effects of the growing evidence of reaction in that trade and this was of cumulative effect on the whole list, owing to the importance attached to the iron trade as an index of general industrial conditions.
