MARKET MORE TORPID. Selling Appears to Come From Influential Sources.

FOREIGNERS SHOW UNEASINESS. Favorable News Does Not Prevent Weak Tone of Copper Industrialists—Sharp Upturn in the Wheat Market Follows Reports of Rain.

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, July 7.—In its general appearance the stock market today was even more torpid than yesterday.

The later market showed effects of relief afforded by this liquidation. The houses which did the selling and the concentrated firm took gave an impression of coming from influential sources.

Foreigners showed some renewal of uneasiness over the copper trade situation. Reports of rapidly expanding activity by the electrical equipment companies, with corresponding demand for copper did not prevent a weak tone in the copper industrialists.

A sharp upturn in the wheat market following reports of heavy rain in the region where harvesting is in progress suggested a fear that he expected good effect of tomorrow's government crop would be neutralized in that way.

Both Southern Pacific and Atchison were the subject of renewed rumors of an intended dividend increase. The money market remained easy in tone.
