

PROSPECTS BRIGHTER

Demand for Stocks Will Carry Prices From Low Level.

CONSIDERABLE RALLY SEEN

Violence of Movement Prove Disconcerting to All But Highly Speculative Element and Recovery Eliminates Substantial Buying.

(By Associated Press.)

NEW YORK, Feb. 4.—Speculative sentiment remained much unsettled today as an after-effect of the violent declines which were effected in yesterday's market.

The rapidity and the extent of the decline which has occurred points to a culmination of ordinary market cycle.

The violence of these movements proved disconcerting to all but the highly speculative elements in the market and the recovery eliminated some substantial buying which was perceived at the lower prices.

The position of the proposed merger as well as the recent statement of annual earnings of the company were assigned as reasons for its vulnerability.

Resistance to pressure in decline in turn gave fresh assurance to buyers, the tone of speculative sentiment was kept shifting, in that way throughout the day.

One of the day's upward movements was in Reading at the close which was strong with net gains for local stocks.

Bonds were irregular. Total sales, par value, \$3,401,000. United States bonds were unchanged on call.
