Trueness of Breeding. The property for which wool is perhaps most valued is trueness of breeding. In a true bred sheep each staple of wool—that is, each lock into which a group of fibres naturally forms itself—will be of equal growth throughout.

Nothing is gained by sowing seeds of tender annuals in open ground before it is thoroughly warmed. Some large seeds will rot, as every gardener knows is the case with Lima beans, and the small ones will not germinate.

There is time yet to hurry forward some flowers which bear transplanting easily. Asters, balsams, Drummond plox, petunias, China pinks, zinnias, browallia, calceolarias, antirrhinums, margolds, four-o'clocks, scabiosas, canary-bird flowers, cypress vines and musarandias, if sown in a cold frame, or a box in a sunny window, will be ready for earlier bloom, when properly cared for, than if sown later in open borders.
