CAMPAIGN POLICY OF REPUBLICANS.

McKinley's Re-election to Be Asked Mainly on the Ground of Prosperity.

ROOSEVELT PLOT STILL LIVES. Effort to Force Him Into Second Place Will Be Attempted—Results of Poll of Party Leaders.

WASHINGTON, April 15.—In reply to the questions: 1. What will be the chief issues of the McKinley party in the national campaign? 2. Who is your choice for Vice President? 3. If the candidate is from New York, what is the best chance—Roosevelt or Woodruff?

Both parties have been attacked. The Republicans are being urged to elect Woodruff, McKinley, partly as a reward for the acts of the administration, but mainly because the nation is prosperous...

When the plot to carry the Philadelphia convention off to Roosevelt as McKinley's running mate was first exposed, it was made clear that it was to be mainly the work of Western delegates. For this reason and because the delegate from the State of New York will be controlled absolutely by McKinley's managers, the inquiries were practically confined to those sections.

It was held on such authority that Senator Platt, like Senator Hanna, does not intend to go to Philadelphia. If Hanna's plan to nominate Roosevelt is carried out, it is certain that anything can be done two months before the convention.
