FERRETING OUT GOEBEL CRIME.

Sensational Testimony Adduced at the Culton Hearing Yesterday.

MATTHEWS ON THE STAND. He Found Three Guns in the Secretary of State's Office. One Was Not Loaded.

Frankfort, Ky., May 4.—Hearing of evidence in the case of W. H. Culton, charged with complicity in the Goebel assassination, was resumed today.

Captain J. F. Howe, a Barbourville military officer, testified that John and John Powers came to him ten days before the assassination and tried to get him to bring his company to Frankfort disguised as citizens.

Colonel Jack Chinn, who was walking with Culton when the latter fired, said that he was sure the shot was fired from the Executive building.

Ed Stoff, who was standing on the porch in the examination, testified that he saw Culton immediately after the shot in the Executive building and that he saw the barrel of a rifle pointing out of the window of the office of the Secretary of State.

The rifle was drawn in and the window was broken in as if glass. Many persons caught out of the houses were severely injured. The hallstones were two inches in diameter and they fell in torrents...
