DOCUMENTS IN HIS WRITING. WAS NOT SATISFIED THERE.

No Prospect of Ending the War Within the Near Future—Natives Overawe the Islands.

Correspondence of the Associated Press. Manila, May 15.—The great store of insurance documents, together with the Aguinaldo plan for the spring in Manila, in his own handwriting, in the Tagalog language, and dated January 3, 1899, intended to be a translation into Spanish, done by the hand of Buencamino.

When the word of the uprising was given they were to slay all American soldiers in Manila. The insurgents were to repair to houses, where they were to hunt down upon the soldiers heavy furniture and any iron implements they might have heated red hot.
