

ALL GRAINS SELL OFF AND CLOSE AT A DECLINE.

BOTH WHEAT AND CORN MADE EXCELLENT START.

Little Buying Support During the Day and Bears Were Soon in Control of Things.

Office Report, Thursday, June 14, 1934.

The bears succeeded in getting control of the speculative situation today and found little opposition to their efforts in getting prices down to a lower level and the two principal grains closed at a decline all around. The dealings in to-day's grain markets on 'change were again of a light character and largely professional, the situation, taken as a whole, differing but not far from that of the past few days. In comparison with the past few days, the market was more encouraging, but it was only a very short time when a reactionary tendency was developed, and there being no support of consequence by traders a general let-down in prices followed, which was never recovered to this, and that was the situation which usually follows the dictates of corn, but in this particular case, it seemed to have an independent strength of its own, and, unlike wheat and corn, closed at a very good improvement in price. Traders, as a rule, to-day were inclined to act with extreme conservatism and reduce rather than increase their holdings.
