MAJOR'S REPORT.

Washington, June 23.—The War Department has received the following cablegram from General MacArthur: "Mindanao, June 23.—Adjutant General, Fortieth Volunteer Infantry, Captain Miller commanding, left Cagayan June 13 on reconnaissance up Tacayan River, morning of June 13, encountered a strong force of insurgents in strong position. Fifty men, sent to reconnoiter, were killed and ten wounded.
