

SCHEME EXPOSED BY A POSTMASTER.

McKinley Managers Are Attempting to Force Officials to Disobey the Law.

NEBRASKAN IGNORED DEMAND.

Refuses to Prostitute a Public Trust to Subserve the Interests of Republican Party—Telltale Letters.

Omaha, Neb., Sept. 30.—The McKinley managers are sending to many postmasters a demand that they become campaign managers in the interests of Mr. McKinley.

This violation of the law is exposed by a Nebraska postmaster, John Emanuele, of Pleasant Valley, who is not afraid to stand up for his principles and expose the doings of the Republians in managers.

The first disclosure from Postmaster Emanuele was a letter written on the letterhead of the Republican National Committee, and in part as follows:

"The American Farmers' League of Commerce and Industries has the information, interests, and support of the Republican National Committee and the Republican candidate."

"In behalf of the Republican party of the nation, we wish to impress upon you, with all the earnestness and zeal at our command, the necessity of encouraging this league organization by joining it yourself and securing at least ten additional members in your locality."

"The league desires to get returns from all localities within five days, and the same will be carefully considered and noted by us, so will be recorded. Yours very truly,

Vice Chairman Executive Committee."

The second disclosure is President Emanuele is this letter from the American Farmers' League of Commerce and Industries:

"221 Dearborn Street, Chicago.

"Your letter addressed by the Republican National Committee and a note of warning seemed of importance. It is expedient you should at once proceed to secure at least ten members besides yourself in your locality, as called for by letters. Increased work and energy, with small expense, will aid in reaching this end. We would like to have you send us a copy of this communication, so the part assigned you. It is a serious personal responsibility to neglect, for it may be that this movement, now well planned, will elect William McKinley, and you cannot afford to make any excuse paramount for not doing so.
