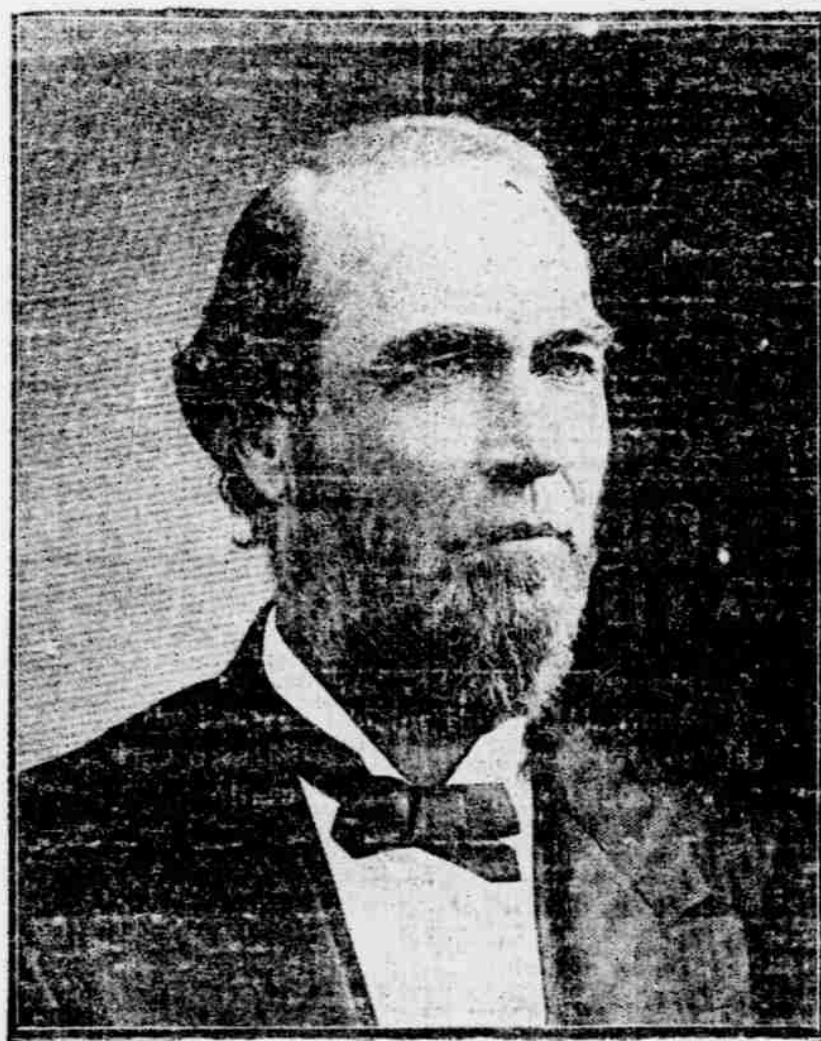

The Reverend Doctor Thomas M. Finney, superintendent of the Missouri Association, died at his home, No. 608 Morgan street, at 6:35 yesterday morning. He was surrounded by his entire family and passed away peacefully. He was 73 years old.

For a week the doctor's condition had been most critical and his death had been momentarily expected. His illness dated from last May, when advanced age caused an attack of debility, and the crisis of the illness was reached a week ago.

The doctor was perfectly conscious up to his death, and realized that his end was near. He talked with those around him when he was able to do so, and instructed them as to his funeral arrangements. He wanted those whom he wished to act as pallbearers, and whom he wished to conduct his funeral.
