STARK CASE IN SUPREME COURT.

Argument on the Evil of the Lobby as a Feature of Legislation. The case was tried before Judge Spencer and the verdict was for the defendant, Stark.

It signifies little what the plaintiff says or what we say; but what this court shall say is of the greatest importance. No court in this country no court in any country having a popular and representative government, has ever approved the claim that makes, and every court in every country possessing a government resting upon public will has denounced his contention, and the highest individual character and the utmost sincerity of purpose have not availed to save the conduct involved from rebuke.

This cause transcends in its importance the consequences to the individuals named as parties in the case. It is a question of the social structure, the functions of legislation are necessarily increasing. Private interests come from year to year to be more and more affected. We cannot stand, if we cannot excuse, their resort to the lobby in defense of what they assume to be their rights. It has always been difficult, and with one consent these interests within the limits of propriety in the methods they employ. Shall we now enlist a lobbying corps of public servants, behind whom the private lobbyists may hide, and with whom they may combine to achieve the selfish purposes by which all will be inspired?
