All of this leads to the belief that he will be substantially rewarded.

At Springfield there is considerable opposition to the present incumbents in the Federal positions, and at several other points in the State there is some rumbling, which may result in a general turnover of the present corps of officeholders.

**DEMOCRATIC GAINS IN THE CITY LEAD TO VICTORY.**

Comparison of Tuesday's Vote With That of 1896 Shows That All Wards Contributed to the Majority.

In order to conceal their claims of the overwhelming defeat administered by the Democratic party on election day in capturing the entire city, the Republican managers and the Republican press are raising the cry of fraud and making the most show of contesting the election of the successful candidates.

The Democratic managers, knowing that the old Republican gain of 1896, were not based on this post-election bluster, severely confident of the justice of their cause, and conscious of the fact that the victory was gained through strictly legitimate methods.

A review of the vote by wards in the city for the various candidates, will be found interesting at this time. The figures are based on the returns made by the official returns handed in to the Police Department by the judges and clerks of election, and while no claim is made that they are final they are as much so as careful computation can make them, and sufficient to show conclusively that the Democratic victory was won through chicanery and fraud at the polls.

If any assurance were needed that the Democratic vote cast at this election was an honest one, the first evidence of this could be found in a glance at the returns for Presidential Electors and Governor. They were held only about 200, and bankers fell below Flory by about 2000. The claim made by the Republicans, that the heavy vote cast for the Democratic ticket, which wiped out the Republican majority, was made possible by the alleged illegal registration in Butler's district, is not borne out by the returns.

The vote in the northern, western and southern wards of the city, as given out of the Twelfth Congressional District, where it is alleged that illegal registration was carried on, show conclusively that the Democratic victory was a legitimate, hard-fought and well-earned one, and that the increase in the Democratic vote was due solely to the honest convictions of the citizens in the east and their hatred against the Zoegler machine.
