DEATH COMES TO ADMIRAL McNAIR.

He was Ranking Officer of His Grade in the Navy and Next in Line to Dewey.

CARRIED OFF BY APOPLEXY.

Had War With Spain Broken Out a Few Months Earlier, He Might Have Been the Hero of Manila.

Washington, Nov. 28.—Rear Admiral Francis G. McNair died at his residence in this city to-day from a stroke of apoplexy. He had been in poor health for many months. Yesterday he was taken violently ill, and to-day his condition became so critical that his attending physician called in consultation Doctor Stone, one of the naval surgeons, but the Admiral slowly sank away. He was the ranking Rear Admiral of the navy and the officer next in line to Admiral Dewey.

REAR ADMIRAL FRANCIS VALLETTE McNAIR was one of the most distinguished officers of the navy. His last active duty at sea was on the Asiatic Station, where, by one of those curious chances of fate, he was relieved upon the legal expiration of his period of command by Admiral Dewey just before the outbreak of the war with Spain. Had he been entitled to a few more months' service in those waters it might have been his privilege to lead the American squadron into the action which gave him success as Rear Admiral in the annals of sea war.
