William H. Mack of New York, Who Is in St. Louis, Is Able to Resist the Efforts of Several Men at Once, but Cannot Explain Source of His Extraordinary Power.

William H. Mack, whose marvelous feats of resistance have astonished thousands of laymen and puzzled the scientific men of this world, has arrived in the city from New York. He will remain here three weeks. He is staying at present at No. 1299 Washington avenue, with Joseph Mount, who will manage his interests here, and who is making arrangements to give an exhibition of the "Boy Wonder's" feats at one of the local theaters.

Mack is 45 years old and weighs 150 pounds. He is of slight, but athletic, build, and very modest and unassuming in manner, though he has exhibited before the most distinguished men of America and Europe. Since he was 3 years old Mack has engaged the attention of the medical and scientific professions by reason of his mysterious force or power of which he is possessed. The source of this force is still a secret, although such eminent savants as Professor Virchow of Berlin, Doctor Chamberlain of Paris, Doctor Sargent of Harvard, and the members of the Royal Medical Society of London have spent weeks in endeavoring to discover it.

CLAGNATES DECIDE TO MEET PLAYERS. PLAN TO PREVENT MCGOVERN FIGHT, TO MEET PLAYERS.

Chicago, Ill., Dec. 11.—Frank Hill, proprietor of one of the resorts recently suppressed by Mayor Harrison, today secured eleven warrants against the principals and promoters of the boxing exhibition at Tattersall's on Thursday night, which is scheduled to wind up with a six-round bout between Terry McGovern and Joe Gans.

Application was made for a similar warrant for Jockey Tod Sloan, who, Hill said, had offered to wager money on the contest. The men, excepting Gans and Rausch, are charged with promoting and encouraging a boxing or sparring exhibition in violation of the criminal code of this State.

The warrants were placed in the hands of Inspector Harnett, who will serve them upon the accused men Thursday evening when they arrive at Tattersall's.

The window glass gave no evidence of any strain upon it whatever.

The Boy Wonder can also control his pulsation and regulate his weight. He stands perfectly still upon the scale and by exerting his peculiar power can register a weight of from 20 to 90 pounds, or no down to 100 pounds, twenty-five pounds below his normal weight.

Mack is unable to explain the source of his power or account for the manner in which he accomplishes such remarkable results. He says hypnosis, mesmerism or any of the occult forces of the East, although this has been suggested as one of the possible explanations.
