Prosecutor Gardner's Comment on the Finding of the Mate to the Fosburg House Shoe.

STATE'S CASE IS WEAKENED.

Evidence Accumulates in Support of Theory That Accused Man's Sister Was Killed by Burglars.

REPUBLIC SPECIAL. Pittsburg, Mo., Feb. 8.—The finding, at a distance of two miles from the Fosburg house, of the mate to the shoe first found on the stair in the house is counted on by the family to add heavily to the accumulating evidence in support of the burglar theory of May Fosburg's murder.

These shoes are a full size larger than those worn by any male member of the Fosburg family, and the one first discovered was bought in New York, at a store when Hackett of the "wire gang" admits that he was in vauclerville in the metropolis.

The police have seemed to proceed on the assumption that the first shoe, along with the trousers and hat, was taken within a quarter of a mile of the house, were "planted" there by the family to manufacture evidence in support of the burglar theory.

It is believed by the Fosburgs that the State will still insist on its charge. A divorce for its assumption, now that Milkman Noble has found the mate to the shoe, will be a serious matter.

It will be charged by the State that the family's story of a quiet evening spent at home by the accused is untrue.

"I had no knowledge of the young man personally," he said, "as I had never seen him. I understand perfectly that it would make a great sensation if a true bill should be brought against him at the sitting of the Grand Jury, and, therefore, I hesitated."
