Welcoming Addresses Made by Archbishop Kain, State President Brinker and the Mayor—Programme for To-Day.



MUNICIPAL PLANS PLANNED.

WATER DEPARTMENT WILL OPERATE LINE BETWEEN BISSELL'S POINT AND CHAIN OF ROCKS. USING POWER FROM WATERWORKS LIGHTING PLANT.

While the movement for city lighting plants is in progress at the City Hall, the Water Department is arranging to operate a municipal street railway between Bissell's Point and the Chain of Rocks.

Proposals were received yesterday morning by the board for erecting the brick generator-house at Bissell's Point for the waterworks municipal light and power plant.

It is estimated that the three generator plants, all to be completed by August 21, will save to the city this year at least \$30,000.

Members of the Board of Public Improvements, contractors and officials of the Nonpartisan Commission for the Public Welfare, will discuss the proposed charter amendments next Tuesday afternoon with the Committee on Legislation of the City Council.

As a special order of business the amendment relating to special taxation for public improvements was debated yesterday morning in a public hearing conducted by the Board of Public Improvements at the City Hall.

The contract with the St. Louis Sanitary Company for the reduction of garbage contains a provision that the city may purchase the plant at the expiration of the ten-year term.

After the report was read in the House, Mr. Sweeney offered a resolution instructing the City Council to arrange for a test case in the construction of public buildings.

Mr. Stanzel was absent. The report of the committee was adopted, and Speaker Cronin appointed a new committee, consisting of Messrs. Burke, Brennan and Cronin.

Mr. Markham made a motion for the adoption of the report. Mr. Horton objected to immediate action, saying a bill should be prepared.
