DENVER PREACHERS CALLED INTO COURT.

Pulpit Utterances Against Judicial Integrity Result in Citations for Contempt. Denver, Colo., June 18.—The Reverend M. A. Rader, pastor of Grace M. E. Church; the Reverend W. H. Talmage, State superintendent of the Anti-Saloon League, and Secretary Walter D. Wynkoop of the Christian Endeavor Society of Denver, were summoned to answer this morning to Judge Palmer's division of the District Court on the charge of contempt. I. P. Stauer, secretary of the Chesapeake Oyster House, swore to the charges.

Attorney Milton H. Smith, who is acting for the Chesapeake and Daniel Cronin, in the saloon injunction cases, appeared as attorney for Mr. Stauer in the contempt cases.

The Reverend Mr. Rader is cited for contempt on account of having made the following statement from his pulpit: "The saloon men prevailed upon Judge Palmer two weeks ago to grant an injunction against the enforcement of the law. I've got respect for our courts as such, but when the District Judge prostrates the bench to the law and the welfare of the community, he is not only a disgrace to the profession, but he is a disgrace to the city of Denver, and that the said injunctions were issued by him at their behest, and that it would be better while for the saloonmen to pay Judge Palmer \$2,000 to make the injunction permanent, but if it were accomplished it would result in a great upsurge of the Christian people of Denver."

Mr. Talmage is also said to have stated in a letter sent in duplicate to a majority of the Denver ministers that "the saloon men have in their power the Sheriff's office, the District Attorney, one member of the Fire and Police Board, Mr. Bottom, and one District Judge."

Working Up Sentiment. Mr. Wynkoop is cited in consequence of his having issued the following notice to members of the Christian Endeavor Society: "Dear Endeavorers: It is desired that at the meeting of your Christian Endeavor Society on Sunday night the president state the fact that Judge Palmer has issued a temporary injunction. He will attempt to permit the saloons to reopen all day on Sunday, unless the better class of the people impress on him that he shall not do so. Ask all present who are in favor of the saloons closing on Sundays to raise their hands; all who will attend Judge Palmer's Court at 10 a. m. Monday, June 19, and see that he gives fair play to the Christians of Denver. Yours for the work, W. D. WYNKOOP."

Judge Palmer set the contempt cases for hearing on June 20. Argument was then begun on the question of making permanent the saloons closing on Sundays, which the ministers had criticized the court. These restrain the police board from prohibiting the saloons from reopening on Sunday, from excluding women from Daniel Cronin's winery.

MRS. CRAWFORD'S SUICIDE.

Took Poison While Suffering From Nervous Prostration. Temporary dementia, due to nervous prostration, is believed to have caused Mrs. Kate Crawford, 51 years old, to take carbolic acid at 1 o'clock yesterday morning, while in her home, at No. 1211 Hickory street. When her husband awoke he found her lying unconscious on the kitchen floor, and had her removed to the hospital, where she died without regaining consciousness.

According to the story told by her husband, who runs a shooting gallery at No. 1211 South Broadway, they came here from Hill, where she had been for some time on a visit to her mother-in-law, who had taken away a short time ago she received a threatening letter, and this caused her to fear that her eldest son, Leslie, whose name was mentioned in the letter, had been killed and had been in very poor health for a long time.
