

GREAT PROFITS FOR CANFIELD, KING OF AMERICAN GAMBLERS.

His Net Winnings at Saratoga Alone for Fifty Days Are Estimated at Six Hundred Thousand Dollars, which Eclipses All Records.

NEWPORT SEASON PROFITABLE.

New York, Sept. 7.—Richard Canfield, king of American gamblers, having cleared about \$600,000 in the season's gambling at Saratoga, and another large sum at Newport, is ready to give his undivided attention to his main, all-year-round gambling-house, the "Saratoga Club," in New York.

Incidentally, it may be stated that he is again confiding to his friends that he has a longing to quit the game and retire into respectability, the enjoyment of home life and the delights of collecting treasures for his art gallery.

Those who are in a position to know say that Canfield has had the most successful season of his career at Saratoga. In fifty days the winnings of his club there amounted to more than a million dollars. His expenses were close to \$75,000, and sometimes the men who patronized him made heavy winnings. But, still, according to estimates, his average net winnings were \$2,000 a day, or \$600,000 for the season.

The game at Newport was neither so heavy nor so profitable as at Saratoga, but, nevertheless, Mr. Canfield is credited with having "cleared" enough there to bring his net profits close to \$1,000,000.

Of course, his Newport establishment has likewise been running all the time, and, in spite of raids and "take-offs," the Canfield exchequer has been materially enriched. But no one who has behind him the authority of information will venture a guess as to the net profit of the New York club for the summer. Gambling has been a short-hand occupation here since Philip and Jerome began to take a hand in it. Regardless of the results in New York, however, the summer season has proved Canfield's title as "king of gambling in America." In fact, there are some who call him the greatest and the most successful gambler in the world—not even counting the royal named gentleman who gives the profits from Monte Carlo. Certain it is that Canfield has risen from the position of clerk in a summer resort hotel with a small salary and a passion for gambling to that of a multimillionaire, whose hold-over comes to a million dollars a year in stocks and bonds, and a horse of ready cash that Russell Sage could hardly duplicate on an short notice.

REMARKS BY MONTICELLO, CLERK. Richard Canfield was born in New England of Scotch Presbyterian stock.
