AMERICA'S FOREIGN TRADE.

Complaints of Slow Deliveries Reach State Department From Amsterdam.

The Republic Bureau, 16th St. and Pennsylvania Ave., Washington, Oct. 24—From Amsterdam, United States Consul at Amsterdam, has forwarded to the State Department a copy of a letter received by him from an American company trading in that city.

"We ordered February 12 of this year a few gross of the same from a Western firm and sold out the merchandise our old stock expecting the new supply at the beginning of July."

"The same thing happened with office desks. Our desk man promised to ship the 40 desks ordered about August 18. At the end of August we received a cablegram instructing our banker to pay against shipping documents."

"As to European imitations of American specialties, we can state that they are not cheaper than American goods and are of very bad workmanship. But we are sure if we showed this people their faults and supported the honest manufacturer as well as manufacturers in the United States, and we would not need to send money three months ago for the goods; on the contrary, we would pay three months after invoice."

"We do not think American exporters will ever be willing to send stock on consignment, but it would be to their interest to keep samples in Europe, and it would be the right place, being on the seacoast and the center of a neutral country."


