

CONVICT O. M. CARTER HOPES TO VINDICATE HIS HONOR.

Has Tossed Nearly Three-Quarters of a Million Into the Scales of Justice in an Effort to Obtain Another Trial—Unless Supreme Court Intervenes on This Appeal He Will Not Be Released Until November 28, 1903—Lawyers Arrange for a Legal Battle.

HIS RECORD AS A PRISONER IS REPORTED PERFECT.

REPUBLIC SPECIAL. Fort Leavenworth, Kas., Nov. 30.—Convict No. 2064 from behind the bars of the United States Penitentiary has tossed \$500,000 into the scales of justice that he may have another trial.

Clad in the prison garb of gray, branded on every garment with the red figures of disgrace, "2064" former Captain Oberlin M. Carter awaits impatiently the moment when, before a civil court, he may vindicate his honor.

There is none of the convict about him. The suit of prison clothes fits him perfectly, and he wears it as though it were his uniform of old. His well-set-up figure is a bit heavier than when his friends saw him in New York, for he is in splendid health, and the regular habits and discipline of the prison have removed the effects of worry and tribulation. His complexion is clear and ruddy, and there is none of the prison pallor in his countenance.

Carter sleeps in a little room on the second floor of the hospital, directly over the "B" block. Two other hospital attendants bunk in the same room with him, one of them being a negro. Each has a trunk in the closet, and the other two are in the hospital in the same room with him.


