UNION STATION TRUST COMPANY.

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TO BEGIN BUSINESS MARCH 1.

Third National and Continental Bank Consolidation—Mississippi Valley Trust Company Elects Officers.

The latest trust company project to come to light is the Union Station Trust and Savings Company, which is now being organized.

The principal mover in the new concern is C. Irvine, at whose offices in the Carleton building a meeting of the promoters was held yesterday afternoon.

According to Mr. Irvine, the Union Station Trust and Savings Company will be capitalized at \$1,000,000.

The names of other projectors are withheld for the present, as it is said, they desire to avoid speculation as to who the officers of the company will be.

The final meeting for electing directors will be held Saturday at 4 p. m., in the offices of Mr. Irvine.
