

ART PALACE PLANS HAVE BEEN ISSUED.

Permanent Fireproof Structure at World's Fair Will Cost \$1,000,000.

BIDS TO BE OPENED JUNE 20.

Sculptural Hall of the Building Will Have Steel Roof Trusses 100 Feet Clear—To Be Completed Nov. 1, 1903.

Plans for the permanent fireproof Palace of Fine Arts, issued yesterday by the Department of Works to the contractors, show an elaborate structure, the architectural masterpiece of which will be the sculpture hall, 156 feet by 94 feet, with a clear sweep of 30 feet from the floor to the barrel vault of the roof, supported by steel trusses.

The building will be constructed either of Roman brick or of Bedford stone, or of marble instead of stone. The material of which the building will be made is not definitely determined in the specifications.

The structural part in the building lies in the foundation. The present grade site for the Art Palace varies from 30 to 125 feet. To equalize this large area would require extensive grading operations.

The three structures forming the Palace are to be fire-proof. The walls will be of brick, Bedford stone or marble will decorate the interior central building.




