HANGED HERSELF WHILE DESPONDENT.

Mrs. Oulvey Ended Her Life in the Room Where Husband Committed Suicide 16 Years Ago.

Melancholia superinduced by brooding over the suicide of her husband sixteen years ago, caused Mrs. Philline Oulvey to hang herself Monday in the same room in which her husband died. Her body was found yesterday morning by her daughter, Mrs. Sebora Theron.

Mrs. Oulvey had lived alone in a little house near the bridge, continuously since the death of her husband, who was 50 years old and managed a small farm. She had one daughter, Mrs. Theron, who lived with her mother, and one son, who was 17 years old.
