CRESCUS LOWERS WORLD'S RECORD

Claims Championship by Trotting Two Miles in 4:17 Flat on Memphis Track.

INCREASES SPEED AS HE GOES. Covers Second Mile Faster Than the First—Prince Alert Beats Pacing Records for Geldings.

Memphis, Tenn., Oct. 31.—Crescus, the great son of Robert McGregor, made good his claim to championship honors this afternoon at the driving park in a remarkable exhibition of speed at the station.

Crescus appeared shortly after 3 o'clock, and after scoring twice, Ketchum nodded for the word. Accompanied by a runner, Crescus went to the quarter in 23. At the half the timer hung out 1:09 1/2, while the three-quarters pole was passed in 1:28.

Another brilliant performance was that of Prince Alert, who was timed at 2:09 1/2 for the quarter in 29 1/2, the half in 59 1/2, the three-quarters in 1:29 1/2, and beating the former record by one-quarter of a second.

COAL COMMISSION GOES UNDER GROUND

Investigates Condition of the Mines and Peppers Men With Questions. WILSON CHIEF INQUIRITOR. Commission Decides That What- ever Ruling Is Made in Regard to Wages Will Be Effective From November 1.

Scranton, Pa., Oct. 31.—The first important action by the Anthracite Coal Strike Commission, which is arbitrating the differences existing between the miners and their employers, was taken today, when it was announced by Carroll D.
