PUBLIC MAY USE CAR TRACKS FOR SAFETY

United States Court of Appeals Defines Rights of Motormen and Pedestrians.

CARE MUST BE EXERCISED.

Judge Thayer Decides Citizens Have Use of Right of Way Under Proper Restrictions—Other Decisions.

In the United States Court of Appeals yesterday an opinion handed down by Judge Thayer, concurred in by Judge Caldwell, defines the rights and privileges of pedestrians and vehicles upon street railway tracks, and the duties of motormen in running their cars.

NEGLIGENCE WAS CHARGED. The plaintiff set forth that the motorman was negligent in not stopping the car when it was running on the tracks.

HAD RIGHT TO TRACKS. He held that the plaintiff in this case had a right to use the street railway tracks in the city of St. Louis.

WIDOW OF JUDGE J. F. LONG.

President Grant Rewarded Benefactor of His Early Days—John P. Becker Disposed of Bible 225 Years Old.

Two wills of more than usual interest were filed in the Probate court in Clayton yesterday.

One told the story of affection for an adopted daughter held by a schoolmate of Mrs. U. S. Grant, while the other revealed a bequest of a family Bible, 225 years old, and other ancient articles of sentimental, rather than intrinsic value.

The first will was that of Mrs. Mary M. Long. She left her entire estate, consisting principally of 20 acres of land on the Gravois road, to her adopted daughter, Mrs. Mary E. Macce.

The second will was that of John P. Becker, who after having become Mrs. U. S. Grant's friend, bequeathed his most treasured possession, a family Bible, 225 years old, to the same daughter.


