
Mrs. Caroline Falk has filed suit for divorce from Charles Falk, she alleging he treated her cruelly.

The Citizens' party has lost several men who have been prominent as leaders and who are now with the Nonpartisan League. These men have been welcomed to the ranks of the Nonpartisan League.

A prominent member of the Citizens' party in an interview, stated the other day that he did not fear the result of the election, as the Citizens' party machine was never better organized and he did not believe it possible for any party to be successful in East St. Louis election without thorough organization.
