TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND SAW CARDINALS WIN.

Final Score Was Eight to Five in Favor of Donovan's Men.

Stung by their defeat Saturday at the hands of the Browns, the Cardinals were out for revenge yesterday, and by outplaying their American League rivals at the game's very end won by a score of 8 to 5. Nearly 25,000 persons were on the grounds.

The victory was well earned, the Cardinals outbitting, outfielding and outrunning the Browns.

Bobby Wallace's bobbles at short, coupled with some poor base running by Barry McCormick and a rather frosty decision of Sheridan's, aided the Cardinals, but hardly enough to change the result of the game.

The crowd was the largest that ever attended a ball game in the city, 25,368 persons witnessing the game. Not only were the stands and bleachers filled, but a large crowd of fans gathered on the field and ground rules were established.

That the reversal of Saturday's result was to the liking of the crowd was shown by the way they greeted every play made by Donovan's youngsters.

WILLIAMS LEADS IN THE BATTING. After the first two innings the Cardinals eluded the flusters of Reidy to take command of the plate, Otto Williams leading with the wallo.


