



GENERAL CORBIN OUTLINES DETAILS OF MAGNIFICENT MILITARY PROCESSION.

ORDERS FOR THE ORGANIZATION, MOVEMENT, AND DISMISSAL OF GREAT MILITARY PARADE.

General Corbin, grand marshal of the military parade, whose headquarters are in the Laclede building, yesterday issued the following orders for the organization, movement and dismissal of the military parade attending the Dedication ceremonies of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, April 28, 1903, based upon arrangements made within the Exposition grounds, for the shelter and subsistence of all troops arriving on or before April 29, 1903.
