Schemers Advertise for "Field Secretary" for "National League of American Women."

CATCH MANY EASY VICTIMS.

Applicants Always Appointed and Asked for Money to Buy Railroad Tickets, but Positions Never Materialize.

REPUBLIC SPECIAL. New York, July 6.—A well-known Hoboken woman, whose name Chief of Police Hayes refuses to disclose, has been made, the latter alleges, the victim of a swindle which he believes is being carried on very extensively all over this section of the country.

The alleged scheme was worked through an advertisement which appeared in a New York newspaper. It called for a "field secretary for the National League of American Women," with headquarters at St. Louis, and promised a yearly salary of \$600 to the right person, stating that the league is devoted to women's suffrage and the amelioration and elevation of the female sex in every way.

The woman alluded to answered the advertisement and a few days later received a reply stating that she had been engaged. A check for \$25 on a St. Louis bank was enclosed and she was asked to forward \$15 to pay for a half-rate ticket to St. Louis, as she had been chosen, it was stated, to represent the league at the St. Louis World's Fair.
