Transit Company Employs Expert Chemist to Scientifically Clean Its Conveyances.

FINDS APPALLING CONDITION.

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swept when they come in. The sweepings I keep for investigation. Then they are washed—floors, seats, windows and blinds. After one or two dryings, which the cars gain, and the dirt saved for laboratory purposes. How to do this work economically and practically will be the result of my investigations. Whether the cleaning is to be done with chemicals or otherwise depends upon the action of these materials upon the materials from which the cars are constructed, and not only wood and cane seat, but the electrical apparatus of each car, must be taken into consideration.

"The next step must be taken by the public in keeping them clean. If people could only realize that they expose themselves to every ailment the human flesh is heir to by not keeping street cars clean, by spitting on floors, behind windows, slits or down the sides of cars, they would at once inaugurate a crusade against their own bad habits, as well as those of their fellow-men."

"The third step must be taken by the city authorities to enforce the spitting ordinance, which is but a dead letter now, and to punish offenders peremptorily. A resolution may soon be introduced in the Municipal Assembly to increase the penalty against spitting, so as to make it of sufficient severity to enforce the regulation."
