Several St. Louis Republicans Take Part in a Quarrel Which Involves All the Leaders and Secretary Hitchcock.

William H. Ludwig, Republican City Central Committee member from the Thirteenth Ward, said yesterday that the report from Muscoogee, I. T., regarding the resignation of Joseph McCoy as Assistant United States District Attorney had nothing whatever to do with his connection with the Canadian Valley Trust Company.

Although McCoy was counsel for the Canadian Valley Trust Company at the time that he was Assistant United States District Attorney, said Mr. Ludwig yesterday, "there was no Government information which he could use for the benefit of the company. Our company cannot make loans on land, as the law forbids, excepting on town lots in certain cities."

"I am certain that Mr. McCoy did have to resign. He has made an efficient government officer, and has been vigorous in prosecuting those who were selling liquor unlawfully or doing any form of violence. The lawless element cordially hates him."

Despite the testimony of his mother that he was at home when the robbery was alleged to have been committed, Homer Walden yesterday was bound over to the Grand Jury by Judge Moore on two charges of robbery in the first degree.

Walden, who formerly was employed by the Transit Company, was charged with holding up and robbing Eugene Conroy of No. 538 Laclede avenue and William Burrell of No. 283 Whittier street.
