OPERATING EXPENSE CAUSES DECREASE IN SURPLUS. Preliminary Statement by the Washab Railroad Company of the Results of Operating for the Year Ending June 30, 1903, as Compared with Earnings for the Year Ending June 30, 1902, which was given out yesterday in advance of the long-expected annual report. It is shown that while the net surplus for the last year is \$5,209,96 less than in the preceding year, it also appears that the operating expenses have increased \$2,388,226.44 over the preceding year.
