TAXABLE COUNTY PROPERTY. Abstract Total Shows Grand Total of \$30,825,730.

County Clerk John Ruhl has prepared an abstract table of the taxable wealth of St. Louis County for the information of the County Court.

The total assessed valuation of land, both acreage and town property, is \$30,825,730. The personal property listed is as follows: Seven thousand, one hundred and fifty-three horses, valued at \$22,400; 3,223 mules, valued at \$13,880; 8,423 neat cattle, valued at \$18,865,432; sheep, valued at \$1,040; 12,867 hogs, valued at \$1,585; money, \$1,514,220; bank valuations, \$1,700; all other personal property, \$1,483,515, making a total of \$30,825,730.
