CHURCH DECORATED IN SATOLLI'S HONOR

Cardinal Will Attend Mass at St. Charles Borromeo's With Other Dignitaries.

WILL DELIVER A SERMON.

Commandator Branchi of Italian World's Fair Commission to Be Present in Uniform With Vatican Commissioner.

Decorators worked until an early hour this morning putting the finishing touches to the decorations at the Italian Church of St. Charles Borromeo, which will be the scene this morning of solemn services in the presence of Cardinal Satolli, Archbishop Glennon and Mr. O'Connell.

The celebration will be distinctly an Italian affair, with a few priests none other than people of that nationality have been invited. The Italian Government will be officially represented in the person of Commandator Branchi of the Italian World's Fair Commission, who will appear in uniform with his aids.

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LADY VOSTOK FLEET AGAIN ESCAPES FROM ADMIRAL KAMIMURA.

Japanese Believe That Russian Squadron Is Trying to Reach Neutral Port and Then Claim Protection—Army Under General Nogi Has Made Important Advance Toward Port Arthur and Now Occupies Heights Withing Ten Miles of the Fortress.

JAPANESE REPORTED TO HAVE LOST EIGHT THOUSAND MEN.

Tokio, July 3.—The Russian Vladivostok squadron eluded Vice Admiral Kamimura Friday night. (Note.—Two weeks ago the Vladivostok squadron made a successful raid, sinking three Japanese transports, and escaped from Kamimura in a fog. At the time many Japanese papers called for Kamimura's resignation, or suggested that he commit suicide.)

The exact movements of the Russians are not known. It is thought Kamimura pressed the Russians into the Tsu Islands in the Straits of Korea, and that the Russians ran east and then north in an effort to escape. Kamimura's scouts discovered the Russians yesterday afternoon, trailed them and reported the Russian's presence.

JAPANESE ADVANCING UPON KUROPATKIN. Liao-Yang, June 2.—The Japanese are advancing over an extended front. The Russian troops are in splendid spirits and General Kurapatkin is in personal command. The Russian's are holding Dalin Pass. Fifteen trains are arriving here daily.
