PRESIDENT WILL SEE INDIANS PLAY

Nation's Executive to Spend Half an Hour at the Stadium Contest.

OTHER NOTABLES TO ATTEND.

Much Interest Taken in Greatest Game Ever Played in St. Louis—Officials Not Yet Named.

The Missouri Athletic Club has definitely announced that the Haskell-Cardale Indian football game will be held under its auspices at the Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

President Roosevelt will attend the game, and it is one of the most pretentious games ever scheduled for St. Louis.

Prince Fushimi, cousin to the Mikado of Japan, and the Duchess of Manchester, formerly Miss Zimmerman of Cincinnati, and Joseph W. Folk, Governor elect of Missouri, will attend the game given to the contest a national aspect.

President Roosevelt and party will arrive at the Stadium before the whistle blows for the contest, and will occupy a box specially set aside for them.

The Duchess of Manchester, like the President, is much devoted to field sport, and will be an interested spectator at the game.

The officials for the game have not been decided on, but that matter will be settled to-day or to-morrow.
