COMMANDER OF JEFFERSON GUARDS IS MADE BRIGADIER GENERAL

Lieutenant Colonel Samuel W. Fountain Advanced by Order of President Roosevelt Yesterday—Veteran of the Civil War Before His Graduation From West Point.

The President yesterday sent the name of Lieutenant Colonel Samuel W. Fountain, Fourth United States Cavalry, to the Senate for promotion to the grade of Brigadier General. Colonel Fountain has been commander of the Jefferson Guards at the World's Fair, being relieved from that duty today.

At the time that Colonel Fountain's nomination was sent to the Senate, that of several other Lieutenant Colonels were sent by the President. They are all officers who served with distinction in the Civil War, but who in the ordinary course would not have reached the grade of Colonel before their retirement under the age limit.

Colonel Fountain, among army officers, bears the distinction of having been a veteran of the Civil War before his graduation from West Point with a commission in the regular army. He was born at Parkersburg, Va., December 12, 1846, and enlisted in the One Hundred and Forty-ninth Volunteers at the outbreak of the Civil War.

He was mustered out at the end of the war and served in the regular army until 1870, when he was discharged. He was then appointed Adjutant General's Department in 1871 in the Philippines as Adjutant General of the Department of Mindanao and later as Adjutant General of the Department of Zamboanga, until 1882. During that time he served under Generals Robbe, Davis, and Wood.
