The Townsend bill provided that the Interstate Commerce Commission shall have the power to fix freight rates on railroads.

It is alleged that he married Maude Eskline in St. Louis County November 25, 1904, while another wife, Fannie W. Wallace, was living.

IOWA WINS NORMAL DEBATE. Defeats Kansas With Negative Side of Income Tax Question. Emporia, Kas., May 8.—In the interstate debate to-night between Iowa and Kansas State Normal schools, Iowa received the question was "Resolved, That constitutionalism granted, there should be a graduated Federal income tax on all individual incomes after an exemption of \$2,000."

CHADWICK TRIAL OCTOBER 3. Date of Hearing in Appellate Court is Fixed. Cincinnati, O., May 8.—The case of Mrs. Chadwick was to-day set for hearing by the United States Court of Appeals for October 3. Judge Lorton announced the decision of the court to effect that in view of statement of former Judge Wing, attorney for the defendant, that he would be unable to prepare the case properly in time for the June term of court, and because considerable time would be required on both sides after the filing of the transcripts, the case would go over until the fall term, but that in the interim of speedy justice this case would precede all others at the October term of court.
