GOVERNMENT TO GIVE AWAY MORE THAN MILLION ACRES IN JINTAH LAND DRAWING

Candidates for Prizes in Uncle Sam's Big Lottery Must Register Before August 12—Offices Will Be Opened August 12 at Vernal, Provo and Price, Utah, and Grand Junction, Colo.—Any Male or Female Citizen of United States Who Does Not Own 100 Acres May Participate in the Drawing.

ONCE MORE THE INDIAN MUST GIVE WAY BEFORE THE WHITES.

REPUBLICAN SPECIAL. Denver, Colo., July 23.—More than a million acres of the Uintah Reservation in Northwestern Utah are to be subject to the land drawing.

By proclamation of the President, under authority of the act of registration for land to be located in a reservation to be determined by lot will be held at Vernal, Provo and Price, Utah, and Grand Junction, Colo., on August 12 and continue until September 12.

Every native-born naturalized male American over the age of 21 who has not availed himself of the homestead right and is not a member of the same tribe and every woman of the same citizenship and above the same age who is the head of a family or unmarried has the same privilege.

Once more the Indian must give way before the white man. Agriculture has been introduced upon him. He is occupying lands that the white man needs.

The narrowing of the strip of the Uintah Reservation in Colorado, in 1873, under the reservation that it now to be opened to the public in all three ranges and to be divided into 100-acre lots.

These spots are of various sizes and value. Some are large and valuable for farming and grazing, and these are to be allotted to white men after the public sale.

In the mountain stretches there are supposed to be deposits of other minerals, the precious metals, but the limitations of prospecting have not been fully established.

The area, 1,000,000 acres have been placed in a permanent forest reserve, which guards the timber, but does not stop the Indians from grazing their herds.

All this morning, about 1,000 heads of families are to draw the prizes of the reservation at the opening on August 22.

There is little of the ordinary planter's private, patient and hardy in comparing a stubble field with the task of opening one of the irrigable valleys. The ground requires no clearing, nature has kept it clear of barbed wire.

At the point of fertility there is no more to be done than to plant the seed. The soil is rich. The labor is light. The crop is abundant.
